4. First reading; K-9 New Handler Training Contract

Captain German said the Macon County Sheriff's Department approached us about retraining their service dog. The handler they had is no longer with the agency and they now have a new handler. We have evaluated the dog and the handler to make sure there are no issues that would be insurmountable regarding the training. It is 8 weeks and no less than 40 sessions.

Commissioner Miller asked what agencies have been trained by Boone County.

Captain German said it is Cooper County, Boonville, Macon County and Wright City.

5. First reading; Extension of Security Agreement and Letter of Credit for Potterfield Horse Barn

Nicki Fuemmeler said this extension is for Sarah Potterfield and her new barn. They are close to being done and the original agreement expires on the 15th and they are asking for an additional two years, but will be done before that.

6. Second; April 2016 and June 2016 OEM Expenses paid to Boone County Fire Protection District (1st read 7-12-16)

Tom Hurley said these are trauma kits that contain numerous bandages for life saving operations during any trauma event. The Columbia Police Department has deployed these at least five times and has saved two lives at this point in time. This is part of an effort across Boone County to equip all law enforcement vehicles. There are 182 in service with another 40 more to come on line in the near future.

These are frequently referred to as Israeli bandages for their ability to not only stop hemorrhaging, but also to provide field dressings that offer a pressure point as well. It has been shown to save many lives, not only domestically, but on the battlefield as well.

Commissioner Miller asked if this will cover everybody.

Mr. Hurley said it will be in all law enforcement vehicles in Boone County.

Commissioner Miller asked if there will be any more purchases of these kits.

Mr. Hurley said that to the best of his understanding, this is it.

Commissioner Thompson asked about the replacement of kits.

Mr. Hurley said that only the portion of the kits that are used will be replaced with new. Not

everything in the kit will be used at one time in most instances.

Commissioner Atwill asked if there will be a storehouse with replacement pieces available.

Mr. Hurley said typically, ER's will offer free stocking as a compliment to law enforcement. These are replacements at no charge as these are their patients that are getting the benefit of the equipment.

There were no further comments or questions.

Commissioner Thompson moved on this day the County Commission of the County of Boone does hereby approve the attached invoices for Office of Emergency Management expenses to be paid to Boone County Fire Protection District as follows:
