Information Technology

8. First reading; ERP Software Selection Project/Project Charter

Commissioner Thompson said IT, the Auditor's Office and the Treasurer are leading the way on this ERP selection project. There will be an RFP process to select the vendor to best meet the county's long term objectives. We want to get something to meet our current needs but be expansive to meet our other needs for the county as we go forward including Payroll. This is a huge project.

We have had multiple meeting with IT, the Auditor and Treasurer on this process and this has been a collaborative approach with everyone throughout the county meeting and talking on how we do certain tasks. The consultants were very forthcoming about how we do the same task in multiple different ways and this is part of the process of correcting that. It has been ongoing and is now ready to be put out for RFP.

Commissioner Parry said he attended the ERP kickoff on December 1st, prior to becoming a Commissioner and knows this will be a great project.

Commissioner Thompson said this software will give us a better handle on what we are doing.

11. 1st & 2nd reading; VOCA Contract Adjustment

Dan Knight said they are requesting approval to accept \$36,366.37 in VOCA funds from Missouri Public Safety for training, furniture, carpeting, a desk, a chair and an additional Karpel license for our Victim Response Team. The training will be for the employees who handle these types of cases involving victims of crimes. The funds allow us to secure the rights of these victims.

Commissioner Thompson said she likes the training opportunities that are available with these additional funds. It makes it possible for more people to go through the training.

Mr. Knight said he agrees with that statement and would also like to mention, since the packet presented to the Commission is quite large, the fact of purchasing a somewhat

different carpet than what is normally purchased by the county. These areas we are dealing with are very high traffic areas and require something more durable.

Commissioner Thompson said the typical carpet we have are replaceable squares. The type we are talking about is definitely for high traffic areas where there is a higher occurrence of spills and other things. This gives us the opportunity to see how this kind of carpet holds up which is touted as one that withstands this type of traffic and wear.
