Prosecuting Attorney

1. First & Second Reading; Approve Extended Leave of Absence: Shelby Reynolds

Bonnie Adkins said the Prosecuting Attorney's Office was requesting an extended leave of absence without pay for Shelby Reynolds, who is one of the legal assistants. She began working for the Prosecuting Attorney in August of 2018 and does not qualify for Family Medical Leave yet, but they would like to extend her leave without pay with plans for her to return on January 22, 2019.

The K-9 dogs become very attached to their specific handler that they work with. Deputy Dunlap and Dallas have bonded over the time that Dallas has been with the Sheriff's Department. Deputy Dunlap will pay the County \$8,500 for the purchase of Dallas.

12. First & Second Reading; Acknowledging receipt of the 2018 Chapter 100 Compliance Report from Kraft-Heinz

CJ Dykhouse introduced Brian Cathro, the plant controller at Kraft-Heinz. Brian Cathro was present to provide the Commission with the 2018 Chapter 100 Compliance Report. The

performance agreement called for the abatement to be conditioned upon Kraft-Heinz achieving at least 300 jobs that pay at or above the County average wage.

Brian Cathro said the company has an average of 460 people making just under \$50,000 a year.

Commissioner Parry thanked Brian Cathro for his support of the local food bank and the other charities supported in the community.

There were no other comments or questions from the Commission.

Commissioner Parry moved on this day the County Commission of the County of Boone does hereby acknowledge receipt of the attached Chapter 100 Compliance Report from the Kraft-Heinz Food Company for the period ending October 31, 2018.

Commissioner Thompson seconded the motion.

13. Public Comment

Stephen Wyse was present to speak to the Commission.

Mr. Wyse said this County, in enforcement of its zoning judgments, has incarcerated Seth Reynolds. There is no public benefit to that zoning ordinance and there is nothing that the County can gain based upon the typography of the land. There is no future development or construction planned. The enforcement of this zoning ordinance is arbitrary and capricious. Mr. Wyse said that he has communicated with the County Counselor's Office an offer of settlement. The Counselor's Office indicated they would not communicate that to the

Commission because he was not the Counsel of record. The Counsel of record, Mr. Schneider, sent an email to the County Counselor's Office giving his consent to have Mr. Wyse communicate on this. No response has been received on whether or not the County would accept the payment of \$1,500 for the technical violation of the zoning ordinance. The violation is in conformity with the neighborhood. There is nothing about the building or the fence that is not in conformity with neighborhood usage of the easement. This citizen has been incarcerated for trying to make reasonable use of their property, a citizen that is trying to benefit local restaurants, and trying to comply. The County issued Mr. Reynolds a permit and then refused to grant him a variance. The enforcement of this ordinance makes no sense. Mr. Wyse asked that the County Commission act in the public good by accepting the settlement offered and freeing Mr. Reynolds from incarceration.

Commissioner Atwill said this is a matter that is a pending legal matter, which he does not personally make comments on.

Commissioner Parry said his understanding is that this is an issue with the Circuit Court, not with the County Commission. Therefore, the reason that Mr. Reynolds is incarcerated is not because of any issue with the County Commission, but rather with his dealings with the Circuit Court.

Mr. Wyse said with all due respect, the County is the plaintiff in this lawsuit. The County obtained the judgment, the County Counselors have asked repeatedly for Mr. Reynolds incarceration. It is completely within the County Commission's discretion.

Commissioner Parry said the Commission will ask for an update from the County Counselor and ask him to get back with Mr. Wyse with his latest response.
