11. Commission Reports

Commissioner Parry wondered if some of this emergency funding for the Food Bank, etc., would be eligible for reimbursement under the CARES Act.

Commissioner Atwill said that several things could be problematic with this. Items are not eligible if they were budgeted for, but the County cannot spend any money without

budgeting for it.

Commissioner Thompson said things that were budgeted for before COVD-19 are not eligible, however, since these things are emergency approvals it might be different.

Commissioner Atwill said this could be an area that will allow the administrators of the CARES Act to question things. He doesn't know if they will, but Commission needs to be aware and alert, and needs to be clear when things are done in relation to the COVID-19 crisis.

Commissioner Parry said the Commission will be on the line to make sure the City of Columbia and Ashland are doing good record keeping for reimbursements as the County will be the fiscal administrators of these funds.

Commissioner Thompson said that goes along with what Commission has been saying about FEMA reimbursement. People need to make sure they are documenting things carefully from the get-go.

Commissioner Atwill said that right now the rules are not clear on if the Commission will just act as a funnel for the funds or if Commission will have an administrative role to make sure the funds are spent appropriately.

Commissioner Parry said he thought he read somewhere that the Commission would be responsible for disbursing the funds and that it would not be based on population.

Commissioner Thompson wondered if the funds would be reimbursable and if it was a first in, first out kind of thing. More requests for funds than funds available becomes a problem.

Commissioner Atwill said there is really nothing that can be done until guidelines are set out. Commission doesn't want to find out later on down the line that some funds were not spent appropriately and then the County has to pay it back.
