Professional Services at \$60.00/hour, not to exceed \$95,000 per contract period Reimbursable expenses not to exceed \$18,000 per contract period

Invoices will be paid from department 2704 – Radio Network Operations, account 71101 – Professional Services. \$113,000 is budgeted for 2021.

3. First Reading: 42-31DEC20C-COVID-19 Outpatient Testing for Jail Detainees and Staff

Director of Purchasing Melinda Bobbitt read the following memo: Angela Ayers, Administrative Deputy in the Sheriff Department, requests approval to utilize the attached intergovernmental agreement 42-31DEC20C - COVID-19 Outpatient Testing for Jail Detainees and Staff with the University of Missouri, Columbia.

The Sheriff Department has been getting their employees COVID-19 tested via the drive-up clinics and University Emergency Room. They also have their Advanced Correctional Healthcare Nursing staff collect any COVID tests on jail detainees and deliver those tests to the University Hospital for testing.

The University bills any detainee COVID-19 tests to the Boone County Sheriff's Department, and any employee COVID-19 tests to Cannon Cochran Management Services, Inc., our Worker Compensation TPA, as those are worker's compensation claims.

The detainee portion of the costs is covered by our contract with Advanced Correctional Healthcare as they are administering the tests. The invoices from Advanced Correctional Healthcare are paid from department 1255 - Corrections, account 85620 - Other Medical.

6. Second Reading: Temporary Amendment of Personnel Policy 3.7

Commissioner Thompson moved now on this day the County Commission of the County of Boone does hereby temporarily modify County Personnel Policy 3.7 as follows:

3.7 Salary Adjustments

The County Commission may appropriate funds in the annual budget for salary adjustments. The salaries of employees who are being compensated at a rate that is higher than the top of their identified salary range will be included in the merit pool calculation for the employees' respective offices or departments for budget year 2021 and 2022. After that time, employees

with pay rates at or above the top of their assigned range will not be included in the merit pool calculation of the employees' respective offices or departments. In general, there are two (2) categories of salary adjustments:

- 1. **Merit Increase:** This increase is allocated by the Administrative Authority from funds authorized by the County Commission and is based upon employees' documented meritorious performance. Increases may vary from employee to employee depending upon performance levels. Appointing authorities may award a merit increase to an employee who is being compensated at a rate higher than the top of their identified salary range.
- 2. **Biennial Adjustment:** Every two years, in odd numbered years beginning in 2017, the County will evaluate its pay ranges to determine if an increase is warranted due to inflation and/or other factors which impact the market competitiveness of the County's pay ranges. The Human Resources Department will review the Consumer Price Index as certified by the Missouri State Tax Commission to measure inflation since the last time the pay ranges were adjusted and report that information to the County Commission. The Commission will make a determination of whether and to what extent to adjust pay ranges. Subject to availability of funding and approval, the County will increase the minimum and maximum rate of pay for each range at a uniform rate. An employee whose rate of pay is below the adjusted minimum for their position will receive a pay increase up to the adjusted minimum, effective on the date the ranges are adjusted.

7. Second Reading: Temporary Amendment of Personnel Policy 2.4

Commissioner Parry moved now on this day, the County Commission of the County of Boone does hereby temporarily amend, through December 31, 2022, County Personnel Policy 2.4 to modify the maximum allowable vacation leave balance for employees due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

For calendar year 2021, the maximum vacation leave balance permitted will be 720 hours. For calendar year 2022, the maximum vacation leave balance permitted will be 600 hours. For calendar year 2023, the maximum vacation leave balance cap will return to three times an employee's annual vacation accrual amount.

Any vacation leave balance above the maximum leave balance permitted will be converted to sick leave on the employee's anniversary date.

The maximum amount of vacation leave for which an employee may receive reimbursement when they separate from County employment remains three times the employee's annual accrual rate.

The components and supporting elements of the plan will be reviewed and updated as necessary, but no less than annually.

The plan is not designed to be a checklist of emergency/disaster actions, or to take the place of valid agency or departmental plans, operating procedures, or guidelines. Individuals and agencies having responsibilities set forth in this plan may have to supplement its provisions during a disaster using resources that are available and actions that are possible to meet incident requirements. The information contained in this plan should be used as flexible response guidelines rather than as rigid procedures.
