The meeting was called to order at 9:30am.

At the start of the meeting a presentation was done honoring Mr. David Horner's 100<sup>th</sup> birthday.

Commissioner Atwill stated we have a special guest with us today Mr. David Horner and his family. Commissioner Atwill stated he wasn't there when Mr. Horner had his actual birthday but that it was a remarkable event. Commissioner Atwill stated it was nice to see Mr. Horner and he thanked him for coming by today.

Commissioner Thompson stated Mr. Horner's birthday was a remarkable event and she would like to thank him for coming by today to make this an official part of the record because, while they were able to present him with the actual proclamation on the day of his party, they wanted to put this into the record today. Commissioner Thompson stated this is on the occasion of Mr. Horner's' 100<sup>th</sup> birthday year and that Mr. Horner is a big part of Boone County's history, not just as a County Commissioner but also as a meteorologist. Commissioner Thompson stated as a father of four, his service as a meteorologist was stunning. Commissioner Thompson recounted how she heard that even though Mr. Horner shares her fear of heights, as a meteorologist, he climbed on top of a very tall ladder to check on weather balloons. Commissioner Thompson

stated that this act astounded her because she thinks about that every time she climbs up into her hay loft. Commissioner Thompson stated one thing she thinks is most important for the history of Boone County, was Mr. Horner's work after Brown vs. Board of Education. Commissioner Thompson stated Mr. Horner's work to create the first integrated school west of the Mississippi was stunning and ahead of his time. Commissioner Thompson stated she is not surprised that Mr. Horner had a hand in that. Mr. Horner stated they worked very hard on getting the building built. Mr. Horner stated he thinks the people at the district voted 7 times before they passed the bond issue. Mr. Horner stated that the school board deserves the credit. Commissioner Thompson stated when she looks at the list of things Mr. Horner has done, including serving on the County's first Board of Equalization, his service for eight years on the Boone Hospital Board of Trustees was highly important, and his work to modernize and expand the hospital to meet the needs of Boone County, Commissioner Thompson went on to say Mr. Horner served for forty-three years on the Board of Directors for the Columbia Cemetery Association, was incredibly active in the Rotary Club of Northwest Columbia, and was named Honorary President of that club in 2017, he served at Calvary Episcopal Church where he was on the vestry and served as Junior Warden. Commissioner Thompson stated another thing that comes to mind that says a lot about who Mr. Horner is that, for six years, he was on the Board of Directors of Planned Parenthood of Central Missouri, something he still supports as it provides primary healthcare services to many of Columbia's low income residents. Mr. Horner stated that was probably the hardest volunteer job he had. Commissioner Thompson stated they would also like to thank him for serving from 1985-1988 as Southern District I Commissioner of Boone County. Commissioner Thompson stated she believes whenever Commissioner Aldred thinks of Mr. Horner, he is thinking how the bar for Southern District Commissioner was set high. Commissioner Thompson stated she feels like every Commissioner looks at Mr. Horner and says "can I do just a small portion of what that man has done?" Mr. Horner stated he thanks them and stated it's all been very interesting. Mr. Horner stated he had great interest in the hospital because he worked as a Commissioner during the first lease. Mr. Horner stated he really commends the present trustees of the hospital and how they are bringing in expertise of equal stature in the interest of operations which is very smart. Mr. Horner stated, since trustees are elected off the street, they don't have the knowledge to run a major institution. Commissioner Thompson thanked Mr. Horner for his service to the community in so many ways and moved that now on this day, the Boone County Commission recognizes and acknowledges David Horner's service to Boone County and his birthday, 100 years ago this summer. Commissioner Thompson stated they wish him well for many years to come.

Commissioner Aldred seconded the motion. The motion carried 3 to 0. **Order #342-2021** 

Mr. Horner stated he would like to thank the Commission and he would like to point out that his daughter Win and son, Richard, present for this meeting, were both born on their first farm, which was 113 acres purchased for \$6,700.00, down by Huntsdale. Commissioner Atwill stated they are deeply indebted to Mr. Horner, as are the people of Boone County.
