The meeting was called to order at 2:30pm.

Purchasing

1. First Reading: Amendment #2 to Contract 45-22AUG19 - Records Shredding & Disposal - Boone County

Senior Buyer Liz Palazzolo read the following memo: Amendment #2 to contract 45-22AUG19 with Shred-It USA, LLC for Records Shredding and Disposal Services that was awarded September 24, 2019 (Commission Order 413-2019) is being amended to delete annual purge service from the contract.

All other terms, conditions and prices of the original agreement as previously amended remain unchanged.

This is a Countywide Term and Supply contract.

Commissioner Atwill stated this is a first reading and requested the Deputy County Clerk schedule this item for a second reading at the next available commission meeting with appropriate order for approval.

Road & Bridge

2. First Reading: No Parking sign placements on Log Providence Road

Director of Road & Bridge Greg Edington stated his department, along with Commissioner Aldred, has gotten a request to have "No Parking" signs posted on Log Providence Road from the end of State maintenance near Hwy. 63 to Woodson Harris. Director Edington stated his department agrees with the analysis due to the nature of the road having one way in and one way out. Director Edington stated the width of the roads is 19-20 feet with minimal ditching and tree-lined banks, which doesn't accommodate any on-site parking.

Commissioner Atwill stated this is a first reading and requested the Deputy County Clerk schedule this item for a second reading at the next available commission meeting with appropriate order for approval.

Emergency Management

3. First and Second Reading: Outdoor Warning Siren Agreement Placement – Louisville Park

Deputy Director of Emergency Management Chris Kelley stated he asked for a first and second reading as he has been working with the City of Columbia to get this done before the end of the County's fiscal year and to be able to get on the City's agenda. Deputy Director Kelley stated they will be moving an existing siren from Scott Blvd, near Sussex, which was placed by the City of Columbia before the County had the siren system. Deputy Director Kelley stated at the current location, there is not great access and, currently, our service contractor has to go through a residential yard, and every time this siren gets service, Emergency Management incurs damage to the lawn adjacent to the siren. Deputy Director Kelley stated they have reached an agreement with Parks & Recreation and City Legal to move the existing siren from Scott Blvd and Sussex to Louisville Park, along Louisville Drive just north of Whitefish Drive. Deputy Director Kelley stated they are requesting the Commission approve this agreement with the City of Columbia.

Commissioner Aldred moved now on this day, the County Commission of the County of Boone does hereby approve the attached Agreement between Boone County and the City of Columbia for The Placement of an Outdoor Emergency Warning Siren in Louisville Park.

The terms of the agreement are stipulated in the attached Agreement. It is further ordered the Boone County Commissioners are hereby authorized to sign said Agreement.
