The meeting was called to order at 1:30pm.

Health Department

1. First Reading: Ashland Animal Control Cooperative Agreement

Director of Columbia/Boone County Department of Public Health and Human Services Stephanie Browning stated this is an agreement between Boone County and the City of Ashland that enables Animal Control to provide services within the Ashland city limits. Director Browning stated the services provided will be equal to the service level provided throughout the County. Director Browning stated the agreement takes effect June 7, 2022 and terminates on June 6, 2023. Director Browning stated Ashland will be paying \$46.08 per hour plus mileage reimbursement at the current IRS rate and they have a "not to exceed" amount of \$6,000.00.

Commissioner Atwill stated this is a first reading and requested the Deputy County Clerk schedule this item for a second reading at the next available commission meeting with appropriate order for approval.

3. First Reading: Amendment #1 to Co-operative Contract 200201 for Trades, Labor & Materials (JOC) for Exterior Masonry Repair & Waterproofing

Senior Buyer Liz Palazzolo read the following memo: Cooperative Contract 200201 for Trades, Labor and Materials (JOC*) for Exterior Masonry Repair and Waterproofing was awarded on September 24, 2020 by Commission Order 424-2020. The Cooperative Contract was set-up by The Interlocal Purchasing System (TIPS) with Mid-Continental Restoration Company, Inc. of Fort Worth, Kansas. The County uses the contract for exterior masonry repair and waterproofing. Amendment #1 to the Contract incorporates a quote to conduct repair and waterproofing on the exterior of the Boone County Courthouse for a total price of \$392,157.00. The work has been requested by the Facilities Maintenance Department which will oversee the project.

Payments for services will reference 6200: Capital R&R – General/60100 – Building Repairs/Maintenance: \$392,157.00.

4. First Reading: Contract for Signature for Boone County: 30/2020 - Counseling Services

Director Melinda Bobbitt read the following memo: Angela Wehmeyer, Risk Management Specialist, Human Resources requests that Boone County be able to utilize the City of Columbia contract 30/2020 for grief counseling services with Lawrence, Oliver & Associates, LLC of Columbia, MO.

This is a county-wide Term & Supply contract with HR as the contract administrator.

Commissioner Atwill stated this is a first reading and requested the Deputy County Clerk schedule this item for a second reading at the next available commission meeting with appropriate order for approval.

5. First Reading: Amendment Number One – 122-123115SS - Radio Signal Equipment. This Amendment updates the vendor name to TX RX Systems, Inc

Director of Purchasing Melinda Bobbitt read the following memo: Contract 122-123115SS - Radio Signal Equipment was approved by commission for award to TX RX Systems Inc. (a unit of Bird Technologies) on April 28, 2015, commission order 188-2015.

Amendment #1 changes the name from TX RX Systems Inc. (a unit of Bird Technologies) to TX RX Systems, Inc. It also adds the Finance Enterprise contract number C000071.

This is a Term & Supply sole source contract. Invoice(s) will be paid from department 2704 – BOCO Joint Comm Radio OPS, account 23035 – Repair/Maintenance Supplies (\$25,000 annual budget) and account 23850 – Untagged Equipment & Tools (\$7,000 annual budget).

6. First Reading: Award Co-Op Contract RP07-20 - Record & Playback Systems for Boone County IT

Senior Buyer Liz Palazzolo read the following memo: Purchasing requests permission to use contract RP07-20 for Record & Playback Systems with Nelson Systems, Inc. of Springfield, Illinois for the Eventide NexLog Call Recorder Software Subscription for the Boone County Information Technology Department. The contract provides an annual subscription for Eventide NexLog Call Recorder services used by the Boone County Emergency Communication Center under the administration of the Boone County Information Technology Department.

The contract period runs July 01, 2022 through June 30, 2023.

Payment will reference Department/Object codes 2708 – 911/Emergency IT Hardware & Software/60051 – IT Equipment Service Contract: \$51,362.52; and 2708 – 911/Emergency IT Hardware & Software/70050 – Software Service Contract: \$15,341.25.

Director Redel stated those positions are currently budgeted as full time, benefitted Emergency Telecommunicator positions. Director Redel stated the department would like to lower these to part time, non-benefitted positions, an action requiring Commission approval.

Engineer McCann stated the request is to close Waldo Court which is a cul-de-sac street with seven homes, for that period. Engineer McCann stated the Department has a standard agreement for these types of events. Engineer McCann stated Boone County Road & Bridge will provide cones to block off the street.

Commissioner Thompson moved now on this day, the County Commission of the County of Boone does hereby take up the matter of permitting <u>Fairway Meadows Improvement and Betterment Association</u>, to use <u>Waldo Court</u> in Boone County, Missouri, <u>between Sarazen Drive and the cul-de-sac of Waldo Court</u> between <u>5:00 pm and 7:00 pm</u> on <u>July 30, 2022</u> for the purpose of a neighborhood association block party and barbeque.

Pursuant to the provisions of RSMo §304.130 to 304.140 and 49.266, as revised, the Commission has the authority to approve the closure for special use of any county-maintained road upon such terms and conditions as it deems appropriate. The Commission has so determined that such use as is described in the attached Special Use Road Permit Agreement between Boone County and <u>Fairway Meadows Improvement and Betterment Association</u> is appropriate.

17. Public Comment

Eric Morris-Pusey from RMF Community Bail Fund stated he is here today to advocate for some of the community ARPA funds to go towards mental health treatment at the Boone County Jail. Mr. Morris-Pusey stated currently, there is no real structure in place for people detained in the Boone County Jail to utilize mental healthcare services except for occasional access to a nurse or doctor. Mr. Morris-Pusey stated if there was a full-time mental health professional, they could both provide services directly to the detainees and provide training to the officers and staff. Peggy Placier from RMF Community Bail Fund stated people might not know how many calls they get from the Boone County Jail. Ms. Placier stated out of 10-20 calls, they might bail out one of those people while the other people just want to talk, or they want to get bailed out but don't qualify. Ms. Placier stated they talk to more people from the jail than imagined. Jeanne Mihail from RMF Community Bail Fund stated many of the people they have an opportunity to talk to generally want to talk and it becomes really clear quickly how large of fraction of people are just not competent to handle their own affairs. Ms. Mihail stated conversations with these people are often disjointed and they are clearly under tremendous strain. Ms. Mihail stated well over half of the people she gives rides to have substantial mental health issues. Commissioner Thompson stated she would like to thank the individuals for coming today and for recognizing this issue. Commissioner Thompson stated this issue is why Boone County joined the Stepping Up Initiative in May of 2015 and Boone County is one of four counties in Missouri that is part of the Stepping Up Initiative. Commissioner Thompson stated the Stepping Up Initiative is a national initiative formed because of the prevalence of individuals in county jails with behavioral health issues. Commissioner Thompson stated as a result of joining the Stepping Up Initiative, Boone County enacted a behavioral health questionnaire that is given in booking and then as individuals are flagged as a result, they will then be asked more questions later on and will receive mental health services during business

hours. Commissioner Thompson stated the Sheriff entered into a new medical contract which provides many more hours of behavioral healthcare. Commissioner Atwill added, regarding ARPA funds, the obligation under the law is for the decision of where where to use the funds needs to be decided by December 2024 with distribution of funds sometime in 2026.
