DESIGNATION OF RECOVERY ZONE

RESOLUTION NO.

AN RESOLUTION DESIGNATING A RECOVERY ZONE PURSUANT TO THE AMERICAN RECOVERY AND REINVESTMENT TAX ACT OF 2009 FOR THE PURPOSE OF ISSUING RECOVERY ZONE ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT BONDS AND RECOVERY ZONE FACILITY BONDS.

WHEREAS, <u>County of Boone, Missouri</u> (the "Public Entity") has received an allocation of the national Recovery Zone Economic Development Bonds limitation in the amount of \$<u>1,412,000</u> and an allocation of the national Recovery Zone Facility Bonds limitation in the amount of \$<u>2,118,000</u> pursuant to the American Recovery and Reinvestment Tax Act of 2009, codified in Title 26 of the United States Code and Internal Revenue Service, Notice 2009-50, issued on June 12, 2009 (collectively, the "Allocations"); and

WHEREAS, the Public Entity understands that the Allocations are to be used for the issuance of

Recovery Zone Economic Development Bonds and Recovery Zone Facility Bonds pursuant to Section 1400U-2 or 1400U-3, respectively, of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the "Code"), such bonds referred to collectively as "Recovery Zone Bonds"; and

WHEREAS, the Public Entity understands that Recovery Zone Bonds are to be issued with respect to or to finance certain expenditures located in or attributable to an area within the jurisdiction of the Public Entity that the Public Entity determines has a significant level of one or more of the following factors: poverty, unemployment, home foreclosures, or general distress (such factors referred to herein as the "Distress Factors"); and

WHEREAS, the Public Entity has determined that the Distress Factors have been caused by one or more of the "Underlying Conditions of Distress" described in Section 1 hereof; and

WHEREAS, the Public Entity desires to designate the area described in Section 3 as a "Recovery Zone" to provide for the possible issuance of Recovery Zone Bonds (such area being referred to herein as the "Recovery Zone");

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE PUBLIC ENTITY, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Underlying Conditions of Distress. The County Commission of the Public Entity (the "Governing Body") hereby finds and determines that the Recovery Zone identified in Section 3 suffers from one or more of the following conditions (each an "Underlying Condition of Distress"):

Check those that apply

X	The Recovery Zone has experienced significant increases in unemployment during the calendar years 2008 and 2009.
	The Recovery Zone has experienced significant increases in home foreclosures and business failures [during the calendar years 2008 and 2009].
	The Recovery Zone suffers from significant poverty.
	Within the entire Recovery Zone there is a significant number of buildings and improvements which, by reason of dilapidation, deterioration, age or obsolescence, illegal use of individual structures, presence of structures below minimum code standards, abandonment, excessive vacancies, inadequate provision for ventilation, light, air sanitation, utilities or open spaces, high density of population and overcrowding of buildings, overcrowding of land, the existence of conditions which endanger life or property by fire and other causes, excessive land coverage, deleterious land use or layout, depreciation of physical maintenance, and lack of community planning, or any combination of such factors, is conducive to ill health, transmission of disease, infant mortality, juvenile delinquency and crime or constitutes an economic or social liability and is detrimental to the public health, safety, morals, or welfare of the Recovery Zone.
	There are substantial real properties on which there is a vacant structure and on which real property taxes have been delinquent for one year or more and orders have been issued by the Recovery Zone's fire official, building official or health official, and there has been no compliance with those orders within the prescribed time given by such official or within ninety days, whichever is longer, or the owner has declared in writing to the building official that the property is abandoned or there has been a determination by the Governing Body that the vacant structure contributes to housing blight.
	The Recovery Zone has generally suffered from declining population or an increase in property tax delinquency.
	The Recovery Zone has suffered from a material decline (using historical numbers) in retail sales.
X	The Recovery Zone has experienced a decline in property tax or sales tax revenues, resulting in budget cuts and an ensuing reduction in the governmental services provided by the Public Entity within the Recovery Zone since 2008.
	The Recovery Zone has experienced economic distress by reason of the closure or realignment of a military installation pursuant to the Defense Base Closure and Realignment Act of 1990.
	A significant portion of the Recovery Zone has been designated as an empowerment zone or renewal community before February 17, 2009.

Section 2. Distress Factors. The Governing Body hereby finds and determines that, as a result of the Underlying Condition(s) of Distress, the Recovery Zone has experienced a significant level of one or more of the Distress Factors (*i.e.* poverty, unemployment, home foreclosures, or general distress):

Section 3. Designation of Recovery Zone. Based upon the findings and determinations of the Underlying Condition(s) of Distress and the resulting Distress Factors, the Governing Body hereby designates the following area as the "Recovery Zone" for the Public Entity:

The appropriate staff and officers of the Public Entity are authorized and directed: to take all necessary steps to indentify appropriate projects for which the issuance of bonds will further the goals established for Recovery Zone Bonds in order to cure the Distress Factors within the Recovery Zone; to identify other economic development incentives and programs which may be available under Federal or Missouri laws for such projects which will further the goals established for Recovery Zone Bonds; and to work with the Missouri Department of Economic Development to plan for the issuance of Recovery Zone Bonds for identified projects.

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE OFFERING FOR SALE OF THE COUNTY'S SPECIAL OBLIGATION BONDS IN THE MAXIMUM PRINCIPAL AMOUNT OF \$840,000 TO PAY A PORTION OF THE COSTS OF A NEW WAREHOUSE STORAGE BUILDING.

WHEREAS, the Missouri Department of Economic Development ("DED") has reserved for the Boone County, Missouri (the "County") until June 30, 2010, an allocation of \$1,412,000 of authority for the issuance of recovery zone economic development bonds as defined in Section 1400U-2 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the "Code") ("RZEDBs"), permitting eligibility for the County to receive payments from the U.S. Treasury equal to 45% of each interest payment on qualifying RZEDBs issued in accordance with Code §§ 54AA, 1400U-2(a)(2) and 6431 ("RZEDB Interest Subsidy Payments");

WHEREAS, the County Commission of the County deems it necessary and desirable, in order to maximize possible interest savings, to issue special obligation bonds of the County in the maximum principal amount of \$840,000 (the "Bonds"), as RZEDBs in accordance with the Code, to pay a portion of the costs of constructing a new warehouse storage building (the "Project"); and

WHEREAS, the County Commission hereby determines it to be in the County's best interest to engage the firm of Piper Jaffray & Co., of Leawood, Kansas, to serve as underwriter/placement agent for the RZEDBs, and to engage the firm of Gilmore & Bell, P.C. of Kansas City, Missouri, as bond counsel for the RZEDBs.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNTY COMMISSION OF THE COUNTY OF BOONE, MISSOURI, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The County Commission hereby authorizes the law firm of Gilmore & Bell, P.C., as bond counsel, to proceed with the preparation of any required official statement or placement memorandum, and all legal proceedings necessary for the issuance, sale and delivery of the Bonds. The County Commission further authorizes the firm of Piper Jaffray & Co., as underwriter/placement agent, to proceed with the offering for sale of the Bonds, the final terms of which shall be subject to the County Commission's subsequent approval.

Section 2. The County expects to make capital expenditures in connection with the Project on and after the date hereof, and intends to reimburse itself for a portion of those expenditures with the proceeds of the Bonds.

Section 3. All officers and representatives of the County are hereby authorized and directed to take such other action as may be necessary to carry out the intent and purposes of these resolutions.

Section 4. This Resolution shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the County Commission.

CONTRACT AGREEMENT (Partial Phasing of Bid Number 53-05NOV09)

THIS AGREEMENT, made and entered into by and between Boone County, Missouri, by and through its County Commission (hereinafter referred to as Owner), and Little Dixie Construction, LLC, (hereinafter referred to as Contractor).

WHEREAS, Contractor is the low bidder on the Bid Number: 53-05NOV09, Boone County Sheriff's Annex and Warehouse, with a base bid of \$1,258,432.00; and

WHEREAS, Owner anticipates awarding the base bid, Alternate #1 and Alternate #3, to Contractor, but can not make any final decision about said contracts until after Owner has secured financing and

WHEREAS, Contractor desires to mobilize on the project to begin site preparation for a building pad; and

WHEREAS, it is anticipated that Owner's financing will be approved over the next 60 days, allowing a full award of the contract to occur; and

WHEREAS, Contractor is willing to phase the project so as to authorize and allow to proceed certain items from the full contract, including the site preparation to be conducted by Contractor's subcontractor, Emery Sapp & Sons, Inc., in order to expedite the construction process; and

WHEREAS, Owner desires to expedite construction as well and is willing to award a partial phasing of the anticipated, total contract; and

WHEREAS, the project architect, Simon Associates, Inc., has agreed to this partial phasing for contract administration purposes; and

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS AGREED by and between the parties as follows:

WITNESSETH: That for and in consideration of the acceptance of Contractor's bid as to this Partial Phasing and the award of this Partial Phasing Contract to said Contractor by the Owner and in further consideration of the agreements of the parties herein contained, to be well and truly observed and faithfully kept by them, and each of them, it is agreed between the parties as follows, to wit:

1. The Contractor at his own expense hereby agrees to do or furnish all labor, materials and equipment called for in the proposal designated and marked:

Boone County Sheriff's Annex and Warehouse

and agrees to perform all the work required by the Contract in strict accordance to the Plans and Specifications, **as it pertains to this Partial Phasing Contract**, which shall include the following work:

1.1 Site grading and building pad preparation by Subcontractor, to include the items identified in Exhibit "A" which is attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference, for a total sum of Sixty Three Thousand Eight Hundred Forty Eight Dollars and Seventy One Cents (\$63,848.71); and

1.2. Acquisition of the Performance Bond and Labor and Material Payment Bond for the entire Boone County Sheriff's Annex and Warehouse project in an amount consistent with the anticipated, total contract amount of \$1,372,840.00, in the form set out in the bid specs, at a total cost of Nine Thousand Nine Hundred Eighty-Eight Dollars (\$9,988.00); and

1.3. Testing by Terracon, for a total cost of Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00); and

1.4. Storm sewers for site, for a total cost of Twelve Thousand Six Hundred Eighty Nine Dollars (\$12,689.00).

2. The following Contract documents and all addenda (if applicable) are made a part hereof as fully as if set out herein. Change orders issued subsequent to this Contract shall be subject to the terms and conditions of this Contract unless otherwise specified in writing.

It is understood and agreed that, except as may be otherwise provided in the General Specifications and the Technical Specifications, the work shall be done in accordance with the Contract Documents. Said Specifications are part and parcel of this Contract and are incorporated in this Contract as fully and effectively as if set forth in detail herein. If a conflict is identified in the Specifications and the Drawings, the more stringent requirement will govern the work. If a conflict is identified between this Contract Agreement and any other incorporated item, the terms of this Contract Agreement shall prevail and control over the conflicting terms.

3. Contractor has made and shall be deemed to have made a careful examination of the site of the Project and of any plans and the scope of work for the project, and shall become informed as to the location and nature of the proposed construction, the transportation facilities, the kind and character of soil and terrain to be encountered, the kind of facilities required before and during the construction of the Project, general local conditions and all other matters that may affect the cost and the time of completion of the Project. Contractor has secured this information by personal investigation and research and not from any estimates of Owner. Contractor agrees to make no

claim against the Owner by reason of estimates, tests or representation of any officer, agent or employee of Owner.

4. Time and Manner of Construction:

4.1. The Contractor agrees to commence construction not later than the authorized date in the Notice to Proceed for this Partial Phasing of the full Contract, and to complete the work within the time specified in the proposal or such additional time as may be allowed by Owner under the Contract.

5. The work shall be done to the complete satisfaction of the Owner, and in the case the Federal Government or any agency thereof is participating in the payment of the cost of construction of the work, the work shall also be subject to inspection and approval at all times by the proper agent or agents of such government agency. All site preparations and daily clean up, including any related costs such as rental of dumpsters shall be the responsibility of Contractor. Contractor shall participate in meetings with Owner and/or Architect as requested to coordinate the work and administer the project. Contractor shall employ stormwater management practices appropriate to the project as required by Owner.

6. The parties hereto agree that this Contract in all things shall be governed by the laws of the State of Missouri.

7. Contractor agrees it will pay not less than the prevailing hourly rate of wages to all workmen performing work under the Contract in accordance with the prevailing wage determination issued by the Division of Labor Standards of the Department of Labor and Industrial Relations for the State of Missouri and as maintained on file with the Boone County Purchasing Department. The Contractor further agrees that it shall forfeit as a penalty to the County of Boone the sum of \$100.00 for each workman employed for each calendar day or portion thereof such workman is paid less than the stipulated rates set forth in the prevailing wage determination for the project for any work done under this contract by the Contractor pursuant to the provisions of Section 290.250 RSMo. The Contractor further agrees that he will abide by all provisions of the prevailing wage law as set forth in Chapter 290 RSMo. and rules and regulations issued thereunder and that any penalties assessed may be withheld from sums due to the Contractor by the Owner.

8. The Contractor agrees that he will comply with all federal and state laws and regulations and local ordinances and that he will comply and cause each of his subcontractors, and directives pertaining to nondiscrimination against any person on the grounds of race, color, religion, creed, sex, age, ancestry, or national origin in connection with this Contract, including procurement of materials and lease of equipment; therefore, in accordance with the special provisions on that subject attached hereto, incorporated in and made a part of the Contract.

9. Records: Contractor shall keep, and require subcontractors to keep, such books and records as shall be necessary to perform the services required by this Agreement and enable the Owner's representative to evaluate the performance of such services. The Owner's representative shall have full and free access to such books and records at all times during normal business hours of Owner, including the right to inspect, copy, audit and make records and transcripts from such records. Such records shall be maintained for a period of three (3) years following completion of the services hereunder, and the Owner shall have access to such records in the event any audit is required.

10. Integration; Amendment: It is understood that there are no oral agreements between the parties hereto affecting this Agreement and this Agreement supersedes and cancels any and all previous negotiations, arrangements, agreements and understandings, if any, between the parties, and none shall be used to interpret this Agreement. This Agreement may be amended at any time by the mutual consent of the parties by an instrument in writing.

11. Severability: In the event that any one or more of the phrases, sentences, clauses, paragraphs, or sections contained in this Agreement shall be declared invalid or unenforceable by a valid judgment or decree of a court of competent jurisdiction, such invalidity or unenforceability shall not affect any of the remaining phrases, sentences, clauses, paragraphs, or sections of this Agreement which are hereby declared as severable and shall be interpreted to carry out the intent of the parties hereunder unless the invalid provision is so material that its invalidity deprives either party of the basic benefit of their bargain or renders this Agreement meaningless.

12. **Adjustment of Total Contract Sum:** If, as anticipated, Owner awards the base bid, Alternate #1 and Alternate #3 to Contractor, for a total Contract Sum of \$1,372,840.00, the Contractor shall adjust the Total Contract Sum, and Owner shall be entitled to said adjustment, for any and all dollar amounts paid under this Partial Phasing Contract, such that if the Owner pays Contractor the full partial phasing contract sum of \$91,525.71, then the Total Contract Sum in the full contract shall be for \$1,372,840.00 *less* \$91,525.71, or a new, reduced Total Contract Sum for the remaining work under the full contract of \$1,281,314.29.

13. The Owner agrees to pay the Contractor in the amount of Ninety One Thousand Five Hundred Twenty Five Dollars and Seventy One Cents (\$91,525.71)

Payments shall be made as set out in these Contract Documents, and payment requests shall be made on forms approved by Owner.
