Media Release Robbery

Incident: Robbery 2nd Degree
Location: 5700 Block St. Charles Rd.
Date & time: 10-31-09 @ 0755

Details:

On 10-31-09 at about 0800 hours the Boone County Sheriff's Department investigated a robbery at a gas station in the 5700 Block of St. Charles Road. A clerk at the store called 911 and reported that a man had stolen money and food items from the store.

The clerk provided a description to investigating deputies of the suspect. The suspect did not threaten or brandish any kind of weapon. The suspect made statements to the clerk that indicated she would be harmed if she did not turn over the money in the cash register.

The suspect was seen running from the store toward the east on St. Charles Road. A witness driving past the area saw the suspect run to a vehicle parked nearby. The suspect was then seen driving away in the vehicle heading east on St. Charles Road.

Another witness saw the vehicle enter a neighborhood in the area at a high rate of speed and turn onto a street with no exit. The witness notified deputies of his observations, and that he had not seen the vehicle leave the street.

Deputies located a vehicle matching the description of the suspect vehicle. After conducting interviews of several residents in the area, deputies were able to identify a suspect. Deputies were then able to connect the suspect to the suspect vehicle.

The suspect, 31 year-old Clayton C. Suhrbier of Sturgeon, was later located and arrested. Mr. Suhrbier was arrested for one count of Robbery 2nd Degree. The bond for Robbery has to be set by a judge. As of the time of this release the bond has not been set. Mr. Suhrbier remains in custody at the time of this release in the Boone County Jail.

All suspects are considered innocent until proven guilty in a court of law.
